WHAT IS A HOUSING CO-OP?

Living in a housing cooperative, or co-op, is a popular choice in Chicago. This form of ownership allows the cooperative to own the entire apartment building.

When you own a co-op apartment, you hold shares and a proprietary lease instead of a traditional deed. All "owners" contribute to a monthly fee that covers the mortgage, property taxes, maintenance, and other property costs.
